The Accidental Anglican

Bishop Todd D. Hunter leads Churches for the Sake of Others, a church-planting initiative of the Anglican Mission in the Americas (AmiA). He is also a teacher, writer and consultant for his ministry, Society for Kingdom Living, which helps pastors and lay leaders reach a generation that has been disenfranchised from the church.

Formerly national director at Vineyard Churches USA, Hunter serves on the Board of Directors and Executive Committee of Alpha as well as on a number of other ministry boards, including RENOVARÉ and Soul Survivor. Prior to his work with AmiA, Todd founded Three Is Enough, a small-group movement that makes spiritual formation doable.

In his first book, *Christianity Beyond Belief: Following Jesus for the Sake of Others* (IVP Books, 2009), Hunter draws from his experience as president of Alpha USA and from his life experiences as an ordinary Christian to reframe salvation and discipleship to focus on life, instead of just heaven and hell. In his second book, *Giving Church Another Chance: Finding New Meaning in Spiritual Practices* (IVP Books, 2010), he relates his journey of finding spiritual refreshment and renewal in the historic spiritual practices of the church. Most recently, Hunter is a coauthor of *The Outsider Interviews: A New Generation Speaks Out on Christianity* (Baker, 2010), which focuses on the “image problem” of Christianity in America today.

Hunter is an adjunct professor of evangelism and postmodern ministry at George Fox University, Fuller Seminary, Western Seminary and Wheaton College. He has written for key publications such as *Christianity Today*, *Charisma*, *Outreach* and *Ministry Today*, as well as contributed to various books and study Bibles. He is also actively involved in teaching and speaking around the country.
