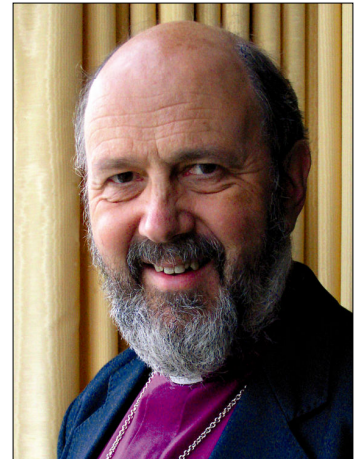


**N. T. Wright**

author of *Evil and the Justice of God*

N. T. Wright is the Anglican Bishop of Durham, England. Previously, he was Canon Theologian at Westminster Abbey. He taught New Testament studies for twenty years at Cambridge, McGill and Oxford Universities. He has been a visiting professor at Harvard Divinity School, Hebrew University in Jerusalem, Gregorian University in Rome and many other institutions around the world.



A prolific writer of both scholarly and popular books, Bishop Wright has written over thirty books, including *Simply Christian*, *The Meal Jesus Gave Us*, *The Original Jesus: The Life and Vision of a Revolutionary*, *What Saint Paul Really Said*, *The Challenge of Jesus* and, with Marcus Borg, *The Meaning of Jesus: Two Visions*. His magisterial work, *Jesus and the Victory of God*, is widely regarded as one of the most significant contributions to contemporary New Testament studies. It follows *The New Testament and the People of God* as the second volume in his projected six-volume series entitled Christian Origins and the Question of God. The third volume is *The Resurrection of the Son of God*. He has nearly completed his work as translator and author of his multivolume For Everyone series of commentaries covering the whole New Testament.

In addition to his many books, Bishop Wright reaches a broad audience through his frequent media appearances. A sought-after commentator, Wright writes frequently for newspapers in England, including the *Times*, the *Independent* and the *Guardian*. He has been interviewed numerous times by radio and television broadcasters on both sides of the Atlantic, including ABC, NBC, CNN, PBS and NPR.

Bishop Wright is married with four young-adult children and two grandchildren.
