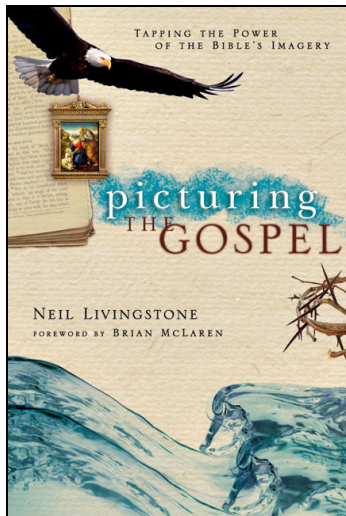

*How did you come to see the gospel as art in a gallery?*

"About 15 years ago, when I was doing campus ministry, I felt this disconnection, this narrowness of the gospel picture I had, but I knew the gospel was bigger and better than that. The outlines, diagrams and sample images I'd been given just weren't communicating. So over one Christmas, I holed myself up in my room with my Bible and a few good books and began my journey with these images. I felt like I walked back out equipped to see all the glory of what Jesus has done through the different images of the New Testament."

*What is the risk of sticking with just one image in  
communicating the gospel message?*

"I risk bending people around to my way of thinking and insisting that they meet God in the same way and through the same series of steps that I did. But knowing God more deeply, I see that he can meet people at different points of their need."

*What do you hope to accomplish with this book?*

"I see a whole generation of leaders rising up in the church, and they often feel constrained by this fractional or reduced gospel that they've been given. They know God is better than that small picture, and they know that people to whom they're preaching need more. Scripture is a deep well of resources out of which they can draw images of Jesus that will speak to all the people around them."

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
