LESOTHO

The Switzerland of Africa

Only three countries in the world are surrounded completely by another country. Lesotho (pronounced Lee-soo-too) is one of Africa. It has no coastline, and no other neighbors. If you visited Lesotho, you would find many mountains, fast-flowing streams, and rushing rivers. Because it's usually cool and damp in Lesotho, people wrap up in warm, colorful blankets. Traditionally, they wear cone-shaped hats, made of woven grass.

Most of the two million people living in Lesotho are Basotho, and speak a language called Sesotho. Lesotho is one of the world's poorest countries. Because there aren't enough jobs in Lesotho, many of the men go to South Africa to work in mines and on farms. Over 300,000 people from Lesotho live in South Africa. Because so many of the men are away, much of the farm work in Lesotho is done by the women.

SHEPHERD BOYS

In many countries, boys go to school while the girls stay at home to help their families. But not in Lesotho. Basotho boys from poor rural families sometimes start looking after the sheep, goats, and cattle when they're still only seven years old. Wool from the sheep and mohair made from goat's hair are two of Lesotho's main exports. The animals are very valuable. If you were a shepherd boy in Lesotho, you would spend weeks away from

home, all by yourself, looking after sheep and goats in the mountains. In summer it rains, and in winter it's very cold. You wouldn't have a warm house, a fire, or even dry clothes to wear. What might you think about during the long, dark nights? What would you do if thieves or wild animals came to steal or kill your animals? You'd be in big trouble if you didn't keep all your animals safe. Remember King David in the Bible was also a shepherd in the Old Testament. May all of Lesotho's shepherd boys be as close to God as David was.

Some of the shepherd boys who can read and write teach their shepherd friends. If boys can read,

DO YOU KNOW?

Lesotho is the only country in the world with its entire area above 3,000 feet. Its higher peaks usually see snow all year round. This is partly why Lesotho is known as "The Switzerland of Africa."



As you enter Lesotho when you go to the mines, boys are popularly to school. But most of the people are poor. A Christian boy who lives in Lesotho has many things to be thankful for.

The towers come on horseback, by plane, or on foot, to explain what the Bible says. But more help is needed.

FLYING AMBULANCE

The Missionary Aviation Fellowship (MAF) has built forty aircraft runways throughout Lesotho. Their planes carry supplies and sometimes fly patients to hospital. "It was lots of fun—but kind of scary—flying in the planes," recalls Moleane, a MAF pilot from the hospital in Maseru. "I broke my arm, and an MAF plane took me to hospital in Maseru. The boys flying out of the plane and seeing me on horseback and bus. It took only three days to get to the hospital."
