All need the redemptive healing of the cross and the body of Christ in order to be “whole-enough.”

Author Andrew Comiskey knows what it means to be broken. For years he struggled with same-sex attraction, even after he gave his life to Christ. But through intimacy with Jesus, as well as caring relationships with people in the church, Andrew was able to exit the gay lifestyle and eventually enjoy a monogamous, heterosexual relationship with his wife, Annette.
