CALVIN MILLER (M.Div., Ph.D., Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary) is the author of more than forty books of popular theology and inspiration. His latest works include *Preaching* (Baker), *O Shepherd Where Art Thou?* (Broadman) and *Conversations with Jesus* (Harvest House). His poems and freelance articles have appeared in various journals and magazines such as *Christianity Today*, *Campus Life*, *Leadership* and *HIS*. Miller is also a well-known novelist, artist and speaker.

Miller's ministry started out in Plattsmouth, Nebraska, where he served as pastor of the Plattsmouth Baptist Church from 1961 to 1966. He went to Westside Church in Omaha, Nebraska, in January 1966, and served as senior pastor there for twenty-five years. During his pastorate the congregation grew from ten members to more than twenty-five hundred members.

From 1991 to 1998 Miller served as professor of communication and ministry studies and writer-in-residence at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas. In January of 1999, he joined the faculty of Samford University's Beeson Divinity School in Birmingham, Alabama, where he is currently professor of preaching and pastoral ministry.

Miller sums up his primary rule for life in four words: "Time is a gift."
