- what constitutes success and failure
- the differences between success and faithfulness
- the theological response to success and failure
- what the Bible states about success and failure
- the ways in which we can move forward from successes or failures
- how Christians can help others through their own successes or failures

Roy has had to face his own failures. But his failures also drove him deep into what God thinks about us and success. He found that a biblically grounded view of success and failure challenges our preconceived notions and leads to hopeful renewal that goes beyond what we often ask or think.
