But the real question is, Does God really like me?

God Has To . . .

Parents sometimes say that while they certainly love their children, they don't always like them. We get it. We both love our children with a fierce and uncompromising love. We would never abandon them or hurt them. But there are times when it's hard to like them.

Sometimes it's because of what is going on with us, and sometimes it's what's going on with them. Sometimes the best we can do is just tolerate our loved ones until it gets better—putting up with them because we have to.

And we've all been on the receiving end of this experience too. A parent or some other loved one tells us they love us when they clearly don't like us very much at that moment—and maybe they would rather not be with us either. We get the real message loud and clear.

After enough of these experiences it's easy to believe God feels the same way about us. God promises to love us. But we actually come to believe that God is just putting up with us, tolerating us because he has to, not because he wants to.

God has to love me, we think, but God doesn't like me.

What if God really does like you?


What if God is always glad to be with you?

We're convinced that everything changes when we believe God is glad to be with us. It changes how we experience God's presence. It changes how we live. It will change your life. When we trust that God wants to be with us, we learn to live as if we belong with God, as if we're really wanted by God. When we trust that God is giving purpose to our lives, we can freely offer our lives as a blessing to others.

Why This Book?

We wrote this book for two reasons. First, you belong in God's presence (*God with us*). Second, you have a place within God's purposes (*God through us*). In other words God is always glad to be with you and wants nothing more than to draw you closer into his family. And from this place God invites you into the family business, the business of blessing the world. We will see that both of these produce joy in us, a joy matched only by God's joy in us.

We would like to take you on a journey from the beginning to the end of God's work with humanity, from Genesis to Revelation. We'll show you how God continually demonstrates a desire to be with his people—no matter what we do. And we'll highlight the ways God always invites people to join him in his unfolding plan to spread new and unending life throughout the entire world.
