# Nine New Postures for Life

Why did you decide to write The Ninefold Path of Jesus?

Mark Scandrette: I think the Beatitudes offer a compelling vision of the revolutionary new way of life that Jesus lived and taught. We live in a politically divided time when there is great confusion about what it means to be a Christian. Jesus invites us into a new consciousness that can change each of us—and our world. I want to see people inspired by the Sermon on the Mount and equipped with tools and practices that will help them experience the fullness of life they were created for.

Describe what the ninefold path of Jesus is.

**Mark:** In the book I describe nine first instincts and nine new postures for life that the Beatitudes (and the Sermon on the Mount) invite us into. The book includes descriptions and illustrations of these postures.

Who did you have in mind as you wrote this book?

#### Mark:

- Emerging adults and others who are "done" with church as usual but are searching and curious about the way of life Jesus invites us into
- Faith leaders who are hungry for a practical and tangible way of describing how to experience a kingdom way of life
- People in search of a more humane, honest, and embodied spiritual path who want to find connections between Christian spirituality, psychology, neural science, and justice concerns
- New Christians who are looking for practical resources for growth
- Faith leaders who want to invite their communities into the path of the Beatitudes
- Individuals who want to develop a way of life inspired by the Beatitudes
- Seekers and skeptics who are looking for a less parochial way of connecting to the Jesus phenomenon

#### What do you hope readers take away from The Ninefold Path of Jesus?

### Mark:

- There is a new way to be human—we can grow and change.
- Jesus shows and teaches us steps into a new kingdom consciousness.
- To change, we need to be honest about the points of ache and struggle in our lives and in our world.
- We can take on practices that will help us live in kingdom reality.
- This is a lifelong journey of self-awareness and new postures of thinking and action.
