
## Introduction to the Breadth and Depth of Theology

From the opening pages of the Bible, we learn of God as one who communicates with humankind—offering us first steps toward knowledge of the divine, the very foothold of theology. On this basis, Approaching the Study of Theology presents an engaging introduction to the breadth and depth of the study of theology, mapping the significant landmarks as well as the main areas of debate.

The book is divided into three parts:

- Part I (Approaches) describes the major approaches to theology that have emerged and developed over time.
- Part II (Concepts and Issues) explains the major concepts and issues, identifying theologians associated with
- Part III (Key Terms) provides a helpful glossary of all the key terms that readers need to comprehend in order to better understand theology.

Anthony C. Thiselton is emeritus professor of Christian theology at the University of Nottingham and a fellow of the British Academy. His recent publications include Discovering Romans, Systematic Theology, The Holy Spirit, and The Last Things.



Thiselton is also the author of **Approaching Philosophy of Religion** (January 2018). This introduction is divided into three parts, first mapping the main approaches, then introducing us to the major ideas and thinkers, and finally giving concise explanations of all the words and phrases readers need to know.
