

She is best known for her detective novels featuring Lord Peter Wimsey; her plays including The Zeal of Thy House and The Devil to Pay; works including The Greatest Drama Ever Staged, Creed or Chaos?, and The Mind of the Maker; and her translation of Dante's Divine Comedy.




KATHRYN WEHR (PhD, University of St Andrews) is a creative artist and scholar. Her written work has appeared in several journals and publications, including *Logos: A*
